- 1.) <u>Arizona-Sonoran Desert Museum</u>-The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum is a world-renowned zoo, natural history museum and botanical garden, all in one place. Exhibits re-create the natural landscape of the Sonoran Desert Region with more than 300 animal species and 1,200 kinds of plants along almost 2 miles of paths traversing 21 acres of beautiful desert. - 2.) Pima Air & Space Museum

 The Pima Air & Space Museum is one of the largest non-government funded aviation and space museums in the world! Featuring over 350 historical aircrafts, from a Wright Flyer to a 787 Dreamliner. Sitting on 80 acres the museum opened its doors to the public in May of 1976. Over the past forty years, the museum has grown immensely and today encompasses six indoor exhibit hangars (three dedicated to WWII). Docent-led walking tours and museum ground Tram Tours are offered daily. For more information, see http://www.pimaair.org/
- 3.) <u>Asarco Mine Tour</u>-Nowhere else in the State of Arizona can you find regularly scheduled, public tours of a working open-pit copper mine available without a prior reservation. On your tour, you'll see how copper ore is mined in the open-pit and then at the center you can see how it is processed in the mill to extract the copper minerals. The mine tour begins at the Mineral Discovery Center. There you can purchase tickets for the tour and become familiar with the copper mining process in our exhibit center and video theater. There is *no admission charge* for the Mineral Discovery Center exhibits, Discovery Theater, or gift shop. Find out more at http://www.asarco.com/
- 4.) <u>San Xavier Mission</u>-A National Historic Landmark, San Xavier Mission was founded as a Catholic mission by Father Eusebio Kino in 1692. Construction of the current church began in 1783 and was completed in 1797. The oldest intact European structure in Arizona, the church's interior is filled with marvelous original statuary and mural paintings. It is a place where visitors can truly step back in time and enter an authentic 18th Century space. The church retains its original purpose of ministering to the religious needs of its parishioners. - 5.) <u>Biosphere II</u>-Come tour one of the world's most unique facilities dedicated to the research and understanding of global scientific issues. The Biosphere 2 facility serves as a laboratory for controlled scientific studies, an arena for scientific discovery and discussion, and a far-reaching provider of public education. Its mission is to serve as a center for research, outreach, teaching and life-long learning about Earth, its living systems, and its place in the universe; to catalyze interdisciplinary thinking and understanding about Earth and its future; to be an adaptive tool for Earth education and outreach to industry, government, and the public; and to distill issues related to Earth systems planning and management for use by policymakers, students and the public. - 6.) Mt. Lemmon-Mt Lemmon Highway is a 27 mile scenic drive to Mt. Lemmon where you will find shops, restaurants, the University of Arizona Skycenter, camping, trails, and Ski Valley. Winter travel may be restricted due to road conditions. Please check road conditions ahead of time. Find more information at http://visitmountlemmon.com/

- 7.) Old Tucson-Old Tucson is one of Arizona's top Wild West attractions, featuring live action stunt shows, musicals and live entertainment, vintage rides for the kids, genuine southwest BBQ and special events throughout the season. Step back in time as you make your way through town, walking the same streets made famous by movie legends such as John Wayne, Clint Eastwood, Elizabeth Taylor, Steve Martin, Sharon Stone and Martin Short. Immortalized in more than 400 films and commercial productions, Old Tucson remains the region's premiere film location. Find out more at http://oldtucson.com/
- 8.) <u>Titan Missile Museum</u>-At the Titan Missile Museum, near Tucson, Arizona, visitors journey through time to stand on the front line of the Cold War. This preserved Titan II missile site, officially known as complex 571-7, is all that remains of the 54 Titan II missile sites that were on alert across the United States from 1963 to 1987.

This one-of-a kind museum gives visitors a rare look at the technology used by the United States to deter nuclear war. What was once one of America's most top secret places is now a National Historic Landmark, fulfilling its new mission of bringing Cold War history to life for millions of visitors from around the world. - 9.) <u>Tubac</u>-Tubac Village and Tubac Presidio State Historic Park provide opportunities to explore the history of southern Arizona, hike, visit art galleries, shop, and dine. Find out more at http://www.tubacarizona.com/

- 11.) <u>Sabino Canyon</u>-Hike the trails or ride the narrated tram tours to view the beauty of this Southwestern Desert Canyon. More information is available at http://www.sabinocanyon.com/
- 12.) <u>Kitt Peak</u>-Kitt Peak National Observatory is the home of a diverse collection of astronomical observatories. Guided tours are available to view the exhibits and spectacular views from the nearly 7000 foot mountaintop. The official website is https://www.noao.edu/kpvc/
- 13.) <u>Reid Park Zoo</u>-Located in downtown Tucson, Reid Park Zoo is home to more than 500 animals on the 24 acre property. Find out more at https://reidparkzoo.org/
