 Meeting was called to order by VP Jack Richards at 6:30 pm Officers in attendance were VP Jack Richards, Secretary Suzanne Monroy, Treasurer Lori Jordan, Governor Ron Scott, Activities Director Stu Gorelick and CIA David Judd.

New business:

- David Judd said that the Club competition points report was being worked on. He also brought back a brochure for the Hawthorne Suites in Ruidoso, NM, as a possible place to stay during the annual Oktoberfest held there each year. This is a possible overnight event for the Club in 2006.
- Lori Jordan stated that there is currently \$6500 in the Club account; however, this does not reflect NCCC dues to be sent to Regional or outstanding SWI expenses.
- Stu Gorelick shared that he will post the written directions to Monroy's for the Progressive Dinner. He also mentioned that there will be a caravan after the 11/18 meeting to a French Bistro (restaurant).
- The annual Awards Banquet will be held on Saturday, 12/10 @ the County Line Restaurant on Tramway @ 7 pm. Cost TBA @ the next General Meeting. He will also remind members to bring a boy/girl toy for Joy Junction, a boy/girl item for the gift exchange (\$10-15 limit); & canned goods. In addition to the \$1000 tire raffle, there will be fun prizes as well as great food! He will also ask members if they are interested in a Club sponsored New Year's Eve party.
- Ron Scott stated that @ the Governor's meeting our Club calendar of events was approved. Our 2006 SWI dates are 9/29-10/1. He also paid our \$128 entry fees to Regional. He also mentioned that Club NCCC membership information needed to be given to him by 11/15.
- The NCCC Points Awards will be given out at the Sweetheart Car Show this coming February.
- Governor Scott also mentioned that our insurance requires a hard copy of all Club newsletters be kept in our records.

Otherwise these positions will be appointed by the new Club President. 1) CIA (Club Historian); 2) Activities Director/Chairperson; 3) Membership Chair; 4) Tech Inspector; & 5) Newsletter Coordinator (sends out the prepared newsletter on a monthly basis).
- 11/12 the annual Progressive Dinner; hor d'oeuvres will be hosted by Suzanne & Hugh Monroy (6 pm), Stu & Karen Gorelick (7 pm) will open their home for the salad portion, and Jean and Steve Haydu will host the main course and desserts (8:15 until ?).
- 12/10 the annual Awards Banquet will be @ the County Line Restaurant off Tramway Blvd. Stu and Wallace will be responsible for this event.
- The next general meeting is @ 7 p.m. on Friday, 11/18 @ CASA Chevrolet; the next Council meeting will be @ 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, 12/6 @ Sandia Computers on Wyoming. All members are welcome to attend.
- The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 by VP Jack Richards.

- President Wallace Bow stated that the go cart track @ 98th & Central is open for business. \$35/day w/your own go cart, you can also rent their carts. There is a 10 lap qualifying run; your fastest lap determines where you are placed in the starting lineup for a 25 lap race.
- Vice President Jack Richards introduced Jim Thomte who has been a member of NMCA a very long time. Jim joined at age 17, and showed off an original club jacket.
- Jack Richards stated that Sandia MotorSports has been secure for the 2006 SWI autocross. In addition, Jack talked about next year's SWI – indicating that he would like members other than NMCA elected Officers to participate in the preparation for SWI. Trophies, registration, hotel arrangements and much more needs to be addressed in the near future.
