Council Meeting Minutes - August 2006

- The meeting was called to order by Vice President Wallace Bow at 6:30 pm. Officers in attendance were President Stu Gorelick, VP Wallace Bow, Governor Jack Richards, Secretary Suzanne Monroy, membership Chair Dan Bond, Competition Director, Hugh Monroy, and CIA David Judd.
- Council members reviewed requirements for hi speed race groups for Pres. Stu Gorelick as he was unable to attend the last General Meeting.
- <u>President, Stu Gorelick</u>, asked the council to consider raising Club dues for 2007; there was a discussion and it was decided that this issue would be tabled until the September council meeting.
- Stu also told the council that he has reserved the Simms Fine Arts Center @ Albuquerque Academy for our Ronald McDonald House magic show. We will be sharing costs for rental and insurance with Ronald McDonald House. Member Donnie Marchi will provide a program along with other magicians in the area. We will attempt to have channels 4, 7 & 13 present for this event. The date of this event will be on Sunday (either November 12th or 19th); depending on the number of tickets sold we will have either 1 or 2 shows that day. The Club will be selling up to 200 tickets for this event @ a cost of \$10/person or \$25/family (max of 6 people). We plan to have our banner prominently displayed at this event. The proceeds of this program will go to Ronald McDonald House.
- Jim Allen, will be donating \$1000 worth of tires again this year. There will be ONLY 200 tickets available @ a cost of \$10 ea or 3/\$25. Further details will be announced @ the next General meeting & the newsletter.
- Competition Director, Hugh Monroy, stated that Treasurer, Lori Jordan, had given him the spread sheets for the past 4 yrs; he has checked into the cost for a tax attorney to address this issue for the Club.
 A motion was made to allow Hugh and Lori to retain an attorney to complete tax returns for the past 4 years as well as this tax year. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.
- Hugh shared that he has spoken with the management at Sandia Motorsports and they will provide the BBQ for Saturday night of SWI at a cost of \$11/person; he will be contacting Powdrell's to cancel catering from them. Hugh will also be contacting CASA Chevrolet regarding having a car show put on by the CASA auto group during SWI; Hugh has offered to provide security for the car show as well. He shared that Sandia will provide RV hookups for SWI at a reduced rate.
- Membership Chair, Dan Bond, asked if static cling decals were going to be included in new member packages; not at this time. He also stated that we have two new members.
- Governor, Jack Richards, talked to the Council about attending the annual Governor's meeting in St. Louis in September; there was a discussion regarding the cost. A motion was made to finance Jack's trip to St. Louis, the motion was seconded and carried unanimously. Jack also told the Council that the artwork for SWI t-shirts was ready; in addition, the place awards for SWI would be based on the number of entrants for each event. The plaques are ready to be produced for 1st through 3rd place. Jack will also be sending out flyers for SWI to all the regional governors.
- <u>VP, Wallace Bow</u>, will check with Route 66 Casino to see if he can get them to contribute lanyards to hold the name tags/event schedules for SWI. He also shared that Route 66 has the banquet room ready for Friday 9/29; Lori has already given them a \$500 deposit. Wallace will also check to see if there is a concert being held on 9/29; he will check into getting tickets for SWI participants if possible. Wallace told the council that Rt. 66 will provide an area where registration can take place for SWI. Wallace reminded the Council that SWI entrants will be allowed to watch the race event on Saturday evening @ the track for no additional cost; we will also do lapping during the half-time.
- Sandia Motorsports has stated that Steve Haydu will have access to the parking area inside the gates on Thursday evening, 9/28, so he can check the layout for setup of the Funkhana.
- The meeting was adjourned by VP Wallace Bow @ 7:30 p.m.
- The next general meeting is @ 7 p.m. on Friday, 8/18 @ CASA Chevrolet. The next Council meeting will be @ 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, 9/5 @ Sandia Computers on Wyoming; all members are welcome to attend.

Congratulations Mr & Mrs NMCA . . . it's a web site!

A new NMCA web site has been born and is now 95% functional. Check out www.nmcorvette.iorg and examine what is available to you. The photo album area will be the final area to become fully operational. Hot news (via the home page), top or latest 4-5 news stories (home page), all previous stories (in "news" area), extensive club information to include By-Laws, dues, meeting information, etc plus Corvette links and the ever-popular "for sale" pages. Certainly worth your effort to visit from time to time.

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Tach Times will continue to be presented monthly via the web site, however there is a small, and hopefully beneficial change. The web version of Tach Times, beginning with the August 2006 version, will be grossly smaller in file size. Logos, graphics and photos will be at very low resolutions whenever possible. The result will be a much faster page load time. The downside is that if printed, the low resolution elements will not print very well. A separate version of Tach Times will be produced each month intended for print, having full or high resolution images which are required for printing.

If you receive Tach Times via the mail, but find that accessing the web site and getting your information faster and in color works best for you, please contact Helga Judd to remove your name from the mailing list. This will save NMCA time, effort and money. If you do not get Tach Times via the mail but wish to have it sent out, contact Helga Judd and get your name on the list. The important end result is to get you the information in a manner which is useful to you.

Finally, a short word about policy and the web site / Tach Times. Unless a member specifically gives authorization or their own contact information (address, phone, e-mail), this information will not be posted for public consumption. For example, members will be advised who the chair person is for an event, but will need to rely on their membership list to obtain contact. This measure is taken to protect the privacy of NMCA members, and is at the request of several members who have experienced negative results from personal information being made public.

Examples of where personal information is virtually mandatory would be the "for sale" pages, where the seller must have a way for a buyer to contact them. Elements like the official SWI registration form and informational sheet require, by NCCC rules, the publication of chair persons and contact information.

Finally, know that NMCA is working to insure minimal disclosure of information when announcing events, etc. If you do not have a current membership list, contact David Judd, NMCA CIA to obtain one. I would tell you how to contact David, but this would violate the entire message above wouldn't it!

Membership lists are, according to By-Laws, to be distributed twice a year (or more) via mail to each member. Members should always have access to a list that is no more than 6 months old.

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The NCCC High Speed Certification requires that the NCCC driver:

- 1) complete a recognized high speed driving school in the 18 months of issuance (recognition of school is up to the RCD), or,
- 2) compete in a minimum of 10 low speed autocrosses during the 18 month period immediately preceding issuance of the High Speed Certification (HSC).

The HSC is good for a period of 3 years. Renewal requires competing in a minimum of 1 high speed event during the 3 year period, or fulfilling the initial requirements listed above in the 18 months preceding issuing a new HSC.

Individuals wishing to obtain a HSC and have autocross events tabulated for this purpose need to contact NMCA Governor Jack Richards.



Vettes On The Rockies - 2006

Following 4 years of hearing about how cool Vettes On The Rockies was, my wife Janet and I cleared our schedule ahead of time and made our way to Colorado for this annual event. The hype was nothing compared to the actual event. This year, as in years past, the focal point was Breckenridge, CO about an hour west of Denver high in the Rockies. 550 Corvettes from 26 states and 3 countries converged for 3 days of true Corvette fun.

Looking Glass Corvette Association hosts the event. Their Denver based club has close to 300 members. More than 50 chair persons where involved, with numerous sub-chairs. The effort paid off. Any time assistance was needed, a LGCA member was there to help, with a smile. Their members did all the work to assemble the event, then worked the event so that all attendees could enjoy themselves. Working a flag position, starters gate, registration, etc is fun for about 45 minutes. LGCA kept a full crew for the duration of each event. Each activity was well planned, well presented and easily understood. The dinners were wonderful, and on time. A difficult task when 50 are eating . . . but they pulled it off while feeding about 700 people. Excellent food too. Then they had prizes on top of prizes, and some were most definitely top-drawer type prizes (like round trip tickets on SWA anywhere in the USA, \$1,500 in tires from Goodyear and a complete driver training/race training package from a high speed driving school). They provided excellent speakers who had solid knowledge about Corvettes and Corvette relate issues. They provided live entertainment. Best of all, they provided a relaxed, fun-filled 3-day weekend where Corvette and new friends were king. And the price of \$85/person as an entry fee was a true bargain. I would highly recommend this annual event to anyone remotely interested in hanging out with 500+ other Corvettes, taking a scenic cruise/ rallye, having fun during a funkhana, or gathering along main street in Frisco. CO with 500 other Corvettes for a spectacular car show and group photo.

Interested individuals should plan to register quickly for future such events, as LGCA intends to limit the available entries beginning in 2007. 2006 was their biggest headcount to date, and they faced issues with dining facilities being large enough, the sheer time it takes to launch 300+ Corvettes for a rallye and providing housing options for everyone. They announced that beginning next year, a registration cut-off would occur when a headcount number was reached. Given what was experienced a few weeks ago, I'd guess that the overall number of registered attendees will be in the 600-625 range, which they certainly exceeded this year. Count on my wife and I to occupy two of those slots, as it was a time to remember.

Finally, New Mexico was well represented, both with NMCA members and residents (who should be members!) Fellow NMCA member Jack Stephens and his son Mike walked away with honors and a trophy for their funkhana efforts. Janet and I felt overly confident that we too had secured a trophy, but apparently someone else slipped in with a slightly better time. We did however cause quite a stir by bringing and donning our own matching helmets. Certainly we'll be featured at some point on the LGCA web site, as the best dressed participants during the funkhana! And next year . . .a trophy is ours!

Also, be sure to ask Jack Stephens and/or Richard Jones about how out of 500+ Corvettes, they managed to be in the front row for the group photograph. These members must be well connected!


