Minutes-October 25, 2006 Meeting

Bob's first order of business was to thank all present for their support since he took office.

Ron Rymarz then gave the Treasurer's Report and said that we had \$8166.27 in our checking account as of this date. **Ron** went on to say that after all expenses had been paid for the Annual Swap Meet and the Museum Show we had made \$2556.84 from funds raised during both events.

Ed McConnell spoke next and told us about the Veteran's Day Parade that will be held in Rio Rancho on November 11, 2006. He also told us that a military museum might be placed in the Rio Rancho area in the future.

Bill Schofield, from the Valencia County Chamber of Commerce, talked about a new club that was formed in the Los Lunas area. This club is called the "Rockin' Rodders."

Annual Swap Meet-

All members present gave **Joyce Clements** a round of applause for work as chairwoman of the Annual Swap Meet. **Joyce** told all present that we sold 236 swap meet spaces and that we almost ran out of spots. She also told us that the Village of Los Lunas was pleased with the way our swap meet turned out. She went on to say that thank you notes were sent out to all the vendors who participated in this event. **Bob Agnew** added that maybe we can have a volunteer's pizza luncheon for all those people who helped out with the swap meet this year.

New Business-

Chuck Logan made a Public Service Announcement urging all present to remind all their members to vote in the November 7 election.

Jim and **Joyce Clements** gave a report about the car show recently held at the Eisenhower Middle School. This low pressure, fun show, attracted some 60 entries and that the show organizers hope to make this an annual event.

Michael Maestas spoke about the large number of car enthusiasts who showed up for Mark Martinez's funeral. He also urged all present to vote on November 7th for the Land Commissioner who would best serve our needs.

Jon Duran talked about NMCCC's new web site and that the annual server cost is estimated to run between \$150-200. And **JD** said this web site could be used to post flyers, calendars, and other general information about the car council and its member clubs.

After **Jon** spoke **Joyce Clements** made a motion that the council spend up to \$300 per year to design, set up, and maintain this web site. The motion was voted on and approved.

Joyce Clements also reported that an answering machine had been purchased for the car council and we now needed a dedicated line to put it on. **Bill Lemen** volunteered to provide that line.

At this time the meeting was adjourned with our next meeting scheduled for January 24, 2007.
