Council Meeting Minutes - May 2006

- Meeting was called to order by VP Jack Richards at 6:35 pm.
- Officers in attendance were VP Jack Richards, Pres. Stu Gorelick, CIA David Judd, Governor Ron Scott, Secretary Suzanne Monroy, Treasurer Lori Jordan, Membership Dan Bond & member, Hugh Monroy.
- Jack presented questions/concerns from webmaster Phil Ellison.
 - a) 5/20 – Vettes vs. Vipers – drag race – who is chairperson? What time to arrive? Cost to members? Trophies? Chairperson should speak to members re: event @ 5/19 General meeting. Lori Jordan will contact Bill Jackson re: whether we have the drag strip reserved. Ron Scott will try to get authorization to this event from NCCC. The cost to rent the track is \$250; it was decided no charge to Club members.
 - b) Phil stated that the website was hacked again last week. The web designer needs exactly what we want in priority order & Phil will provide this info. \$500 allotted for the site is not enough to include our current online photo album.
 - c) Please provide page locations for sponsor logos/ads. Stu will forward required info & logos on to Phil for publication in the monthly newsletter.
 - d) Membership list should be sent out at least twice/calendar yr. Suggestion: once a month CIA send a complete valid member list to all officers. Also, NMCA competition pts should be posted quarterly.
 - e) Suggest that stories/photos for publication to the newsletter be sent directly to the webmaster @ info@nmcorvette.org.
- Jack then went around the room for updates from each Officer present.

Guest member, Hugh Monroy, brought to the Council the idea of meeting w/other clubs in the area, specifically SWMS (Southwest Motor Sports), to discuss getting together on events. Stu will contact SWMS president & attend the next SWMS meeting w/Hugh to discuss how we can help each other. Hugh also suggested that we clarify which events listed on the NMCA website are sanctioned NMCA events & which are Wallace Bow events.
- David Judd, CIA, will bring the current competition points to the next General meeting.
- Stu read information sent by Activities Director, Larry Osborne, re: the cost for dinner @ the next General mtg. being provided by Ambrosia, \$11/ea. An email will be forwarded to get a count before the mtg.

He also shared that the new larger storage shed being rented to house our Club equipment is inside protected from weather; he has also changed the billing address to the Club P.O. Box. He had 4 keys made & will give 3 of the keys to Pres. Gorelick for distribution to Officers as well as the passcode to the facility.
- Membership Director, Dan Bond, stated that he has sent out 6 new member pkgs. He also requested permission to purchase additional logos; this request was approved by the Council. He is also having additional new member cards printed.
- Lori stated that all bills are paid. She also talked about the upcoming Rt. 66 Car Show; the cost is \$25/car. It was suggested by Stu that the Club cover the entry fee cost for members attending this event; the motion was seconded & approved by the Council. In addition, she talked about the Museum Car Show 5/21 & suggested that Club participants meet as a group @ 7 a.m. @ the Albuquerque Inn (formerly the Old Town Sheraton) & go together w/NCRS & the Rio Grande Clubs. Lori will talk to the Rio Grande Club @ their next mtg. There was a motion to have the Club cover the entry fee cost (\$10/car) for the Museum Car show; the motion was seconded & approved by the Council. The CORVETTE is the featured car this year.
- Secretary, Suzanne Monroy, stated that the Bunting's have offered their home for the Progressive BBQ (dinner & dessert portion) in August; she will ask for another family to volunteer their home for the BBQ. She will also need someone to take notes @ the July Council & General mtgs as she will be in Europe during July.
- Governor Ron Scott, shared that information re: insurance information from the NCCC Governor's mtg. He will give a presentation on NCCC @ the next General mtg. He stated that the National Convention host hotel in Orlando, FL is the Disneyworld Hotel. Check the NCCC website for costs, dates & additional information.
- VP Jack Richards talked about the upcoming SWI; he is having difficulty getting coordination from volunteers; he will ask for help again @ the next General mtg. He would also like suggestions for the BBQ portion of the event; Powdrell's is not returning his calls. The Outback was mentioned as an alternative.
- Pres. Stu Gorelick said that a representative from Ronald McDonald House will attend the next General mtg. May 19. He also stated that he would contact Doug Bird re: his attending the next NCRS meeting. Stu will ask for a show of hands of those who plan to attend the Rt. 66 Car Show & those who will participate in the Museum Car Show 5/21.
- The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 by VP Jack Richards.

- The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by President Stuart Gorelick.
- The dinner preceding the meeting was catered by Ambrozia. Once again we had a good crowd.
- Stu talked about going to Sierra Vista last month; Steve & Theresa Rahe, Jack Richards & Stu all attended. Everyone placed!
- Stuart introduced Dale Masko, who gave an overview of how his organization supports the Ronald McDonald House here in Albuquerque. The House is in the process of increasing the number of residences provided @ a low cost to families of children who need long-term hospitalization. They will also be helping furnish an area w/in the new UNM Hospital where families can go to get away from the hospital atmosphere while visiting with their children. Stu stated that the Council would be making a decision in the near future regarding the amount of funding the Club will raise/contribute to Ronald McDonald House in 2006.
- Stu asked any new members to introduce themselves & tell us what year Vette they own. Leo has a '59 Vette; Jackie Haydu, an '89 Vette; & Mike Rothman has a '71 Vette.
- Vice President, Jack Richards, asked everyone in attendance to complete the questionnaire he passed out & turn it in at the end of the meeting. We want to get a clear idea of what type of events the membership wants to participate in.
- Stu shared w/members an event taking place 5/26 in Cortez, CO; it's a cruising event free of charge.

- Treasurer, Lori Jordan, stated that we are current on all bills. She also talked about the Museum Car Show Sunday 5/21. We will meet @ the Albuquerque Inn @ 7 am and drive into the show w/the NCRS & Rio Grande Clubs. The entry fee is \$10 which NMCA will reimburse to any Club members who attend (just keep your receipt & turn it in). This year the Corvette is the featured car.
- Lori also told us that during the caravan to Los Alamos in April, she met the very first NMCA president, Jack House. He gave her some old pictures & a copy of the roster of members. Stu will scan these documents & send them on to the webmaster.
- Stu reminded everyone about the Rt 66 80th Anniversary Car Show, 6-23-25 @ the Albuquerque Inn (formerly the Old Town Sheraton). The Club will also reimburse the \$25 entry fee for Club participants. Get your registration forms in ASAP (see our website & download). He also reminded members to continue to use the punch cards passed out in April; every time we buy something or have our cars serviced @ any CASA dealership we get our card punched. Turn your completely punched cards into Larry Osborne & he'll issue you a new one.
- Member/sponsor Bruce Behrends asked when his ad will appear on the website; also, when will his business be added to the Club banner? Stuart said that he will be taking care of the banner this week.
- Bill Jackson mentioned that every Saturday morning from 7-9 am there is an informal car show @ the Krispy Kreme on Juan Tabo across from Lowe's. There has been an increasing number of cars showing up each week, so come on out and join us. Everything from Vettes to Messerschmidts have been on display!
- Chuck Tipton stated that Sandia Motor Sports Complex has invited our Club to provide a car show @ the track on a Saturday night.
- CIA, David Judd, told the membership that he keeps track of all sanctioned NCCC events points accumulated by members & at the end of the year the winners receive a free dinner @ our annual banquet & their dues reimbursed for the upcoming year. David also asked that any members who are not receiving emails or the newsletter to let him know if they have an address or email change & he will update the membership list. He also asked how many members would be interested in attending the Oktoberfest in Ruidoso, NM 10/21-22. About 10 folks stated they were interested in attending; David will check into getting a motel rate for the Club.
- Governor, Ron Scott, gave a talk about NCCC our National Corvette Association, insurance, events & the cost to join; initial cost \$35/renewal \$20 annually. This fee allows members to participate in National competition events from coast to coast. NCCC has sanctioned events such as autocrosses, concours, rallies & car shows. When you receive your NCCC package there is a coupon inside which allows you to get a copy of the Rule Book (it is your responsibility to know the rules before you participate in any event, don't depend on others to inform you). In addition, NCCC annually holds a raffle to raise money for the American Kidney Foundation. This year the National Convention is in Orlando, FL; 2007 in Nashville, TN; 2008 in Tulsa, OK.

May general meeting minutes, continued:

- NCCC also has a novice autocross program; after 10 sanctioned events w/in 18 months, you can receive a card which allows you to participate in competition events. You can also attend a certified racing school to qualify. NCCC members also have a \$1 million insurance policy which covers against 3rd party liability. There is also a minimal medical allowance coverage. However, if you participate in a parade & a passenger falls out of your vehicle you are not covered. NMCA is part of the Roadrunner Region of NCCC which covers AZ, NM & El Paso, TX. Roadrunner is only one of 15 regions in NCCC. If you have any questions re: NCCC, please don't hesitate to ask Ron.
- VP, Jack Richards, talked about the Indian Summer Southwest Invitational (9/29-10/1); our annual NCCC points event. This will be the 37th year for SWI & we usually get a good turnout from other Roadrunner Region clubs. There will be 7 events: 2 autocross (Wallace Bow), funkhana (the Haydu's), People's Choice Car Show (Suzanne Monroy & Lori Jordan), golf event (Stu Gorelick), matching times event (?) & Powdrell's will provide a catered BBQ dinner on Saturday night. In addition, Friday night there will be a banquet @ Rt. 66 Casino, Saturday night a parade lap around the track @ intermission & free entry to the road races. Jack asked for 2 volunteers to set up the route for a rallye.
- Stu then introduced our newly appointed Competition Director, Hugh Monroy. Hugh went over some upcoming events; he talked about NMCA getting together w/SWMS car club for racing events. He & Stu will meet w/SWMS officers Tuesday 5/23. Hugh also told members that if you enter an event you can download the proof that you entered the event off the internet. If you are trying to get certified you will need to show proof of entry to 10 sanctioned events w/in 18 months.
- Public Relations Director, Wallace Bow, stated that the Vettes vs Viper drag races will take place in late July. We have already received an NCCC sanction number for this event; details on the exact date & time will be on the website shortly.
- May 13, there was an auto cross practice/time trials @ Sandia MotorSports in preparation for the Southwest Invitational this coming September. The timing equipment worked well & we are good to go!
- Secretary, Suzanne Monroy, shared that Brenda & Mark Bunting have graciously offered their home for the BBQ portion of the progressive BBQ 8/26. She asked that members consider offering their home for the appetizer/salad portion of the event & let her know by July 1st. She also told members that Mike Robb was hospitalized for surgery & is now home recovering. Then Suzanne asked for someone to take notes for the July Council & General meetings as she will be out of town; Gloria Osborne stepped up. Thank you Gloria!
- Activities Director, Larry Osborne, stated that he would have a suggestion box outside the meeting room w/paper & pencil at each meeting. If you have any suggestions for the Council, let us know. He told members that next month Subway would provide the pre-meeting supper for \$5/person; drinks & chips included.
- Watch for information re: a car show @ CASA Chevrolet on Lomas in late June. Ron Scott will request a sanction number from NCCC.
- There were drawings for door prizes; the meeting was adjourned @ 8:15 pm by Stu Gorelick.

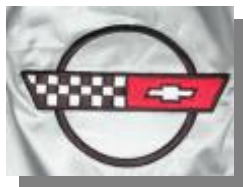

Museum Car Show May 21st

Getting seniors signed up

The \$1.3 trillion Medicare benefit has proved to be a struggle for bureaucrats as they deal with flaws and assemble a competent work force to help people choose plans

WASHINGTON — A six-month roller-coaster ride for America's seniors concludes Monday — the last day to sign up for Medicare prescription drug coverage without financial penalty.

About 10 million people likely will have signed up, meaning about 90 percent of the Medicare population will enjoy coverage from some source. It is a historic level of enrollment for a new government program, ac-

According to Health and Human Services Secretary Mike Leavitt.

But the massive \$1.3 trillion benefit has been a work in progress as bureaucrats have tinkered with flaws and struggled to

assemble a competent work force of telephone and in-person counselors able to guide thousands of seniors daily through menus of up to 40 possible plans.

Outside government investigators reported that they were given incomplete and sometimes wrong information from the 1-800-MEDICARE operators most of the time they called the hot line several months ago. Medicare officials insist the program has gotten better since then.

"The first few months of the program's

implementation was widely acknowledged to be a mess," said Judith Stein, executive director of the Center for Medicare Advocacy, one of many advocates who urged that the May 15 deadline be extended. "People need time to get over that rocky start."

But the deadline has stayed in place because administration officials have always felt that relatively healthy seniors with low drug costs need to be part of the risk pool to

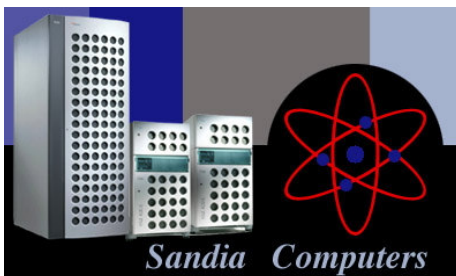

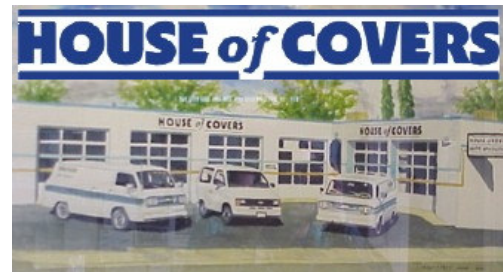
