The business meeting was called to order by President, **Dennis Seibert**. A big THANK YOU was given to all the workers who helped with the stuffing. It was a great group, and we had a good time.

Treasurer, **Lisa BonDurant** will be temporarily unable to serve. **Ron Rymarz** volunteered to fill in until **Lisa** can assume the duties.

All present had received their newsletters. No guest speakers were in attendance.

Joyce & Jim Clements reported on the progress of the Swap Meet to date. **Jim, Joyce, Will**, and **Dennis** have met with representatives from the Village of Los Lunas, and they are very happy with our event. We are working with them to overcome the mud problems of the north field. The Village will provide more portapotties and help with signage. We are working on a more economical security force. They also volunteered to do some in-state and out-of-state ads in newspapers for the event. Color posters are being printed by the Village, and will be available for reps to distribute. E-mail registrations have been sent, and we are working on perfecting the on-line registration. All indications are that it will be a great meet.

Ron Rymarz gave the treasurer's report: the Council is in the black for the year so far, as bills for the Swap Meet are not coming in yet. Report was approved.

Collector Car Appreciation Day report was given by **Su Rymarz**. Over 100 cars showed up at Mild to Wild for the reading of the official proclamation by **Dennis Seibert**. And then there was the hot dog lunch. Thank you much to hosts, **Tony Kos & Sons**, and to servers, **Liddy Misener & Bill Lemen**. **Gabe Trujillo** played DJ and kept the music going, and announced the door prizes. Thanks to these volunteers, all got fed. Our favorite frugal shopper, **Louie Paul**, got deals on the food, and the event came in under budget. There was also a lot of tire-kicking and tale-telling going on. About 35 cars continued the day, cruising south to Los Lunas for ice cream, where the group overwhelmed the local Baskin Robbins. By all accounts, it was a really good day.

Joyce showed a large certificate and a thank you letter from SEMA. The certificate was a copy of the proclamation made by the US Senate recognizing Collector Car Appreciation Day nationwide. SEMA has been really pushing for positive recognition of our hobby.

A motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously, to make CCAD an official Council-sponsored activity each year, with clubs taking turns organizing an event. The Rickshaws will take over the day for 2014.

Louie Paul spoke about the All Clubs Picnic plans. He still needed volunteers to help set up, cook, and take down. Also, desserts, sodas and ice were still needed. Several people spoke up to help.

A motion was made that the Council purchase a grille for CCAD, the All Clubs Picnic, the Swap Meet, and any other event where a cooker was needed. After considerable discussion about storage, moving, cleaning, and usage, the motion passed with two dissenting votes. The cost will be about \$400, and guidelines need to be drawn up about care, usage and storage of the unit.

The next motion was that the Council purchase a trailer in which to store its belongings. We have a storage unit with many items in it already, paid for by contributions from various clubs. The storage unit can be sold for what we have in it, and the money applied toward the trailer. The advantage to a trailer is that items can be moved to the show, picnic, CCAD and swap meet without being loaded and unloaded into a vehicle each time. A lengthy and productive discussion followed about storage, maintenance, insurance, who tows it, cost, and size needed. The idea was tabled until more details can be presented. There will also have to be some strict rules created for its use.

Several upcoming events were announced.

The meeting was adjourned.
