The Car Council is a current member of SEMA. Any club may join free. It keeps members updated about proposed legislation that affects the car hobby nationwide. It is recommended that your club sign up; do it at www.semasan.com/san/join.aspx. It's free.

The State Automotive Enthusiast Leadership Caucus was founded in 2005 and supported by SEMA. The Caucus is designed as a non-partisan group of state legislators whose common thread is a love and appreciation for automobiles. An aggressive recruiting effort initiated in 2014 has once again brought an impressive number of lawmakers into the group. With 98 new members signing up so far this year, it now numbers about 665 total members representing all 50 states. The New Mexico members are Representatives Nate Cote, Jimmie C. Hall, Rudy Martinez, Bill Rehm, and Bob Wooley. These are legislators you can contact if you have suggestions, or just to say "Thank you" for supporting our hobby.

Ethanol-Free Gas: There are 23 stations in New Mexico that sell ethanol-free gas, and over 7,000 stations nation-wide. To find a list, go to www.pure-gas.org and click on the desired state. This is a good resource for older cars that don't like the gasohol too well.

Old Business:

Car Show Report- Joyce Clements reports that after we paid our bills for the Albuquerque Museum Show that we netted \$886.44. She also reported that we netted \$4017.76 after we paid our bills for the 2013 Annual Swap Meet in Los Lunas.

Collector Car Appreciation Day-Dennis Seibert and Ron Rymarz reported that we had 150 vehicles on display at the Mild to Wild Classics Shop, and we served lunch to some 500 or so people who showed up for this event. From Mild to Wild a group of 43 cars headed south to Los Lunas for an ice cream social in honor of this event, and then vehicles headed back up to Albuquerque for a car show at the Sonic Drive-In on San Mateo to end the day on a special note.

NMCCC Name and Changing Logo Status Update- Paul McLaughlin showed a rough sketch he had drawn up to change our logo. **Mike Maguire**, a member of the Logo Committee, spoke about contacting the Zia Pueblo Council's Governor's Office about the use of the "Zia" symbol and he was told by a woman in the office that all we had to do to continue using the "Zia" symbol in our logo was to submit a letter to the tribal council saying that we are a non-profit organization and we would like permission to use the symbol in our logo. To which **John Doran**, another Logo Committee member, stated that the problem wasn't with the Governor's Office but with the tribal lawyer who wants us to pay a fee for the use of the "Zia" symbol. A discussion followed, but then **Dennis Seibert** intervened and told the "Logo Committee" to come up with a decision and present it at the next meeting, and that the council would support any decision the committee made.

New Business:
