## MINUTES OF NM CAR COUNCIL GENERAL MEETING – July 22, 2015

Incoming President **Lauri** called us to order at 7:35.

In attendance were: **Mark Terkeltaub**-NM Pontiac Club; **Jamie Saavedra**-V8 Vixens; **Michelle Garcia**-LOE GTO's; **Pat & Chuck Logan**-Cougar Club; **Don Boyd**-Camino Real Run (guest); **James Clements**-Tumbleweed V8's; **Bob Agnew**-Classic Car Club; **David Merewether**-Tin Lizzies, Jaguar Club; **Tom Lamb & Perry Key**-NM Auto Artists; **Robert Gold**-Corvairs of NM; **Lauri Rector**-NM 4 Wheelers; **Jeff Rector**-Rickshaws; **Joyce Clements**-Old Car Club.

**Lauri** gave the Treasurer's report, showing a positive balance with money currently going out for Swap Meet expenses. Several checks and deposits are still outstanding.

**Don Boyd** gave a presentation on the upcoming El Camino Real Car Show & Auto Rallye in Socorro County. The persons promoting the idea are the Socorro County C of C and J. R. Seeger. Activities commence on Friday, September 4 at the Capitol Bar in the evening, scavenger hunt-type rallye on Saturday afternoon, a reception on Saturday evening, more show on Sunday, and a banquet on Sunday evening. Visits will be made to the VLA site, El Camino Real visitors' center, Magdalena, and lots of activities will occur in town. The routes will be on two-lane blacktop. The cost is \$200 for car, driver and passenger, which covers the entry fee, reception, banquet and admission to the sites. **Robert Gold** reported that he and **Jamie Saavedra** had met with **Paul Krause** about additions and maintenance for the web site. The Council needs to get Google apps for routing purposes, and we need to have a permanent hosting site. **Paul** will serve as our IT, with the Council having administrative control. The domain name will remain .com, as the .net and .org will not be available for the time being. We will need to redo the e-

mail, so as to have more than one contact available. The Council will control the site under **Paul's** direction. We will take no action on the e-mail until November or December, when activities are slow. **Joyce** will meet with **Paul** after the Swap Meet to work out details. This whole operation will cost \$300 plus a small monthly fee. A motion was asked for. **Chuck Logan** made the motion: The Council will use \$300 to set up a hosting site with **Paul Krause** as the IT, and \$5 per month (\$60 per year) for setting up the Google apps. **Joyce Clements** modified the motion to add "**Robert Gold** has the authority to negotiate any details necessary with **Paul Krause**, without coming to the Council for approval." **Jim Clements** seconded the motion. As a quorum was present, a vote was called, and the motion passed unanimously.

**Jamie Saavedra** reported 923 "likes" on facebook and many more visits. She has posted flyers for events and a printable registration form for the Swap Meet.

**Joyce** thanked all who helped at the May Car Show and reported a profit of \$38.54.

Reporting on Collector Car Appreciation Day, it was generally agreed that the event was well organized this year – the Hot Dogs were ready early! There was a good turnout, and the Village of Tijeras was pleased – the Mayor turned out to greet the participants.

Under New Business, **Joyce** talked about the upcoming Swap Meet. Flyers have been mailed and e-mailed, and about 80 spaces are paid for so far. A list for volunteers was passed, and many attendees signed up to help. A request was made to appeal to club members for more help. This has turned into a major event, and we need all the help we can round up.

**Jamie** talked about the All Clubs Picnic coming up August 9. She passed a volunteer list for food and utensils needed. The cost will be \$5 per car load, and the location will be Oak Flat Picnic Area. She and her crew are working hard to round up everything needed, and it seems to be coming together and under control.

At the close of the meeting, **Lauri** made a pronouncement. She decided that the Council meetings need to be held earlier to get reps out before dark. She stated that the next four meetings will start at 6:30, and there will be no discussion of the matter until the January meeting. **Jim Clements** asked if she was going to take a vote on the matter, or just impose it. **Lauri** reiterated that there would be no discussion or vote until January.
