Swap Meet Notes from Joyce: We sold 410 spaces at the meet. That compares to 550 last year, or about 75%. With help from the parking crews, we managed to squeeze in about 25 more spaces that we thought was possible. We were almost stacking them in. Considering the changes in the space layouts, the meet went smoothly. The vendors seemed to take the changes in stride, especially our long-timers. We have attracted a great group of vendors and shoppers from all over the country and beyond. We had vendors from 46 New Mexico communities and 5 other states; our vendor from furthest away came from Washington state. Saturday morning crowds filled the parking lot and roadsides all around Morris field. A lot of club members volunteered to help out with marking the field, parking the vendors, serving hot dogs and beans, delivering parts and general supervision. **Bill Lemen** fielded phone calls for months and kept us supplied with water and ice. **Jamie Saavedra** and **Mark Terkeltaub** worked hard on the hobo dinner and hung out the whole weekend helping wherever needed. **Jim** and **Will Clements** spent the summer helping me create maps, setting up the field, and helping

with mail and pre-registration, and many odd jobs on site. **Lyle Schultz** created graphics and provided printing.
